Bradford doctor explores new way of communicating with patients

A GP surgery in Bradford is pioneering the use of patient text messages. Holycroft Surgery, Keighley is the first practice in the country to send the messages directly from their clinical computer system, SystemOne. This is saving time and money and giving patients peace of mind - just by sending a simple text. Using IT to improve patient care is part of the Government's NHS National Programme for IT being rolled out in the North East by Computer Sciences Corporation (CSC) with an alliance of partners including TPP.



So, it's not all about patients remembering their appointments - through SystemOne, GP surgeries can send you texts about your test results, they can let you know about any new clinics they're running - in short, they can send you a text about almost anything! And, as with all communications between doctor and patient, the information in the text is saved in your patient record.

SystemOne text messaging is being offered to GP practices across the North, Midlands and East of England as part of the Government's National Programme for IT.
